New Standard on Web Accessibility

The [Standard on Web Accessibility](#) came into effect on August 1, 2011. This standard applies to all institutions listed in schedules I, I.1, and II of the *Financial Administration Act* and will be implemented in three phases over a two-year period.

The Standard on Web Accessibility is accompanied by a [guidance document](#) to facilitate implementation by July 31, 2013. The supporting guidance provides useful direction to senior departmental officials, who are responsible for supporting deputy heads in adhering to the requirements of the Standard on Web Accessibility. Additional information on specific deliverables, tools, solutions and upcoming reporting requirements is also provided.
